Representative Tucker,

We are opposed to Amendment 248 to House Bill No. 1. We find that the amendment would create districts drawn without the regard for neighborhood boundaries and the redistricting would be detrimental to our residents. Actually the amendment splits our neighborhood in two different districts: 82 and 94. The Upper Audubon Association, chartered in 1950, represents about 350 households. Our boundaries are from the riverside of St. Charles Avenue to the Mississippi River and from Audubon Park to both sides of Broadway. We do not believe that splitting the representation of this small neighborhood into two separate districts is to our benefit.

We support your original bill creating one "uptown" district and believe that it would align communities with common interest.

Please reconsider your support of this amendment.
