My name is Francine Brown, and I am a resident of North Louisiana. I am from Shreveport, Louisiana which is the third largest city in the state of Louisiana. I'm a graduate of Southern University in Baton Rouge with community ties from my hometown to Baton Rouge. I have witnessed the political, economic and social inequities that exist in Shreveport. I'm the founder of Seniors First, a nonprofit organization designed to re-integrate seniors back into the community through mentorship as liaisons to reduce risk factors associated with-age and-death related illnesses in senior citizens. Senior citizens suffer from a lack of community support and SB-1 adds insult to injury that further takes the power away from community.
